# Key Projects of 2015-2017

## The Hope Makers

In our latest venture to inspire wider eco-positive change, The Fund partnered with MakerBay to create the groundbreaking “The Hope Makers” programme. 25 youth participants took part in series of training, equipping them with the latest environmental technology trends, design thinking skills and makers skillsets. As part of this inspired experience, each team will create a prototype using IoT solutions to reduce waste for a targeted community by at least 5%. Prototypes with high potential will be targeted to obtain resources for a full product launch.



# Key Projects of 2015-2017

## Communities Router

Communities Router is co-organized by HKBN Talent CSI Fund and MaD Institute. It breaks through the traditional community programme framework by providing opportunities for 80 youngsters to rediscover Hong Kong's communities through field visits that incorporate comic creation with help from HKBN volunteers and comic book artists. The co-created comics will be compiled into a Community Comic Post and later circulated to convey the unique local stories with the community.



# Key Projects of 2015-2017

## Partnership with Tsuen Wan Trade Association Primary School

Tsuen Wan Trade Association Primary School is constantly mired by financial challenges and the risk of under-enrollment. The Fund offers funding to renovate its kitchen and library to create a better learning environment for their students.

HKBN volunteers have also pledged to help provide an array of extra-curricular activities like STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) classes, English cooking classes and buddy reading involvement to enrich their learning experiences.



# Key Projects of 2015-2017

## Youth Upward Mobility Mentorship Program

Through career guidance, HKBN volunteers helped secondary school students who did not attain satisfactory results in the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination become certified professional broadband engineers. HKBN volunteers acted as mentors, providing guidance and encouragement for newcomers in the workplace through team building and experience sharing. Participants are also given time off to continue their education besides work, a key factor to remain competitive in the labour market in long run.



# Key Projects of 2015-2017

## Running Mentors

The Fund organised the 'Running Mentorship' programme in collaboration with the Hong Kong Playground Association to bring together 12 HKBN volunteer mentors with over 30 local youths. In helping these youths gain the persistence to overcome running distance challenges, our mentors also served as life coaches.



# Key Projects of 2015-2017

## St. James' Settlement x HKBN Hot Meal Service

As part of HKBN's annual management experiential trip, 35 HKBN Talents completed a two-day 145 km charity bike ride across the hills of Kenting, Taiwan in November 2015. On top of encouraging our Talents to step outside their comfort zones, this journey enabled them to channel energies on the road into a force for good for the St. James' Settlement People's Food Bank. In total, more than \$1.1 million, equivalent to more than 35,000 hot meals for 100 local families, was collected.
