About Mother's Choice

Changing the life stories of vulnerable girls and babies; making sure every child in Hong Kong has a loving family. Mother's Choice is a local charity that works with single mothers and crisis pregnancies all over the region. Influenced by a series of 1986 news reports citing increasing numbers of teenaged girls going to Mainland China for late-term abortions - when local support systems were sparse - Mother's Choice was established. Today, Mother's Choice has supported over 53,000 girls through crisis pregnancies.

Alia Eyres CEO, Mother's Choice

Prior to joining Mother's Choice as CEO in 2012, Alia Eyres started off her career as an illustrious corporate lawyer in Hong Kong & New York with a JD from Georgetown University. The eldest of Ranjan's 7 children, Alia grew up in Hong Kong, spending her early years volunteering at Mother's Choice. Passionate about **entrepreneuralism**, Alia decided to shift her career towards charity and lead one of Hong Kong's most respectable charities.



Ranjan Marwah Co-Founder, Mother's Choice

One of the four early co-founders of Mother's Choice in 1987, along with his wife Phyllis, and an American couple - Gary and Helen Stephens - Ranjan Marwah is a successful businessman and entrepreneur. He first migrated to Hong Kong from India in 1971 – in search for a better life. Started off unemployed and with no money, Ranjan built a better life for him and his family by creating numerous successful businesses, and most importantly, Mother's Choice!

Reflection:

"When I benchmark Ranjan's achievements, they seem superhuman and unachievable, but then I remember to reference his starting point of coming to Hong Kong in 1971 with no money, no job, and realize the impossible is possible."

Resolution:

"Feed your CURIOSITY. This is how you break free from your comfort zone. You must first release your grip on 1 pencil (i.e. GIVE) so that you can accept more pencils."

Reflection:



"In transitioning from law to Mother's Choice, Alia highlighted that she had to evaluate what 'success' meant to her individually. In her account of taking 18 months to convince donors to sponsor internet access for Mother's Choice, she also showed that one person's definition of success can sometimes mismatch another's. (The donors did not see internet access as crucial to the success of Mother's Choice.) Even in cases with aligned success (i.e: Mother's Choice CEO and Mother's Choice donors, or HKBN Co-Owners), different individuals will imagine different paths to the same success."

Resolution:

"When my plan towards aligned success differs from others, it is my responsibility to convince them, not theirs. Alternatively, if others approach me with new paths to our aligned success, I resolve to listen and be ready to adapt."

I have learnt about what contributed to the entrepreneurship of both Ranjan and Alia, and how courage and passion are both required for taking a leap forward, for making this world a better place. "Alia mentioned that she asks her children to write something they're grateful for everyday, asks remind themselves that life is blissful.
